

What about the secretary that dries tears and holds them in her arms for a

Do You Remember?

Truman counselor,

Leo Diroff, is somewhat of an icon in Taylor. This year marks two milestones in his life: his fiftieth year as a Taylor educator and his eightieth birthday. During his Taylor tenure, Leo has crossed many paths and touched many lives.

Leo Diroff didn't begin his career path with education in mind. He attended seminary for seven years with the intention of becoming a missionary. When health issues arose, he had to leave and his path changed. Leo began his new career when the principal of St Alfred's in Taylor called him and offered a teaching position, even though Leo only had 77 credit hours. If Leo promised to finish his degree, St. Alfred's would hire him to teach grade 5 to 8, all subjects.

Leo accepted the offer, and after one year, his brother Larry was also hired as a teacher. Larry taught all the math classes, Leo taught all the English classes, and the nuns handled the rest.

In 1961, Leo applied to Taylor Center High School where he taught English until Kennedy opened. On February 8, 1965, Kennedy opened its doors to students and teachers, even though it was still under construction. Leo began teaching 3 Latin classes in room 217.

Since Leo didn't start his first class until 10AM, he got a part time job driving a school bus for parochial schools. Leo continued to teach Latin and the number of Latin classes continued to increase.

In 1973, his career path took another turn when he became a counselor at Kennedy. During the great layoff of 1980, Kennedy was forced to reduce the number of counselors, and Leo's low seniority sent him packing back to Taylor Center. When Taylor Center closed, Leo moved to Truman, still as a counselor. Leo remains in that position at Truman today.

Even though his teaching schedule became full time in 1966, Leo continued his "other" career as a bus driver. From 1966 to 1990, he drove for Greyhound. After that, he continued to drive a charter bus for Corporate Travel.


As one can imagine, after fifty years as an educator, Leo acquired many memories. One of Leo's favorite memories was the senior honor convocation dinners held at Roma Hall in Livonia or the Roostertail in Detroit.

Another favorite memory was the boat rides on the Detroit River that were arranged by John Pantalone. A dinner at Sinbads and many laughs always followed.

If you are one of the privileged alumni to have had Leo as a teacher or counselor, you know how fortunate you were. Leo is rare gem among educators, and after fifty years, he is still going strong.
