We are in the process of getting the small plaques to attach to the Kennedy school bricks along with the certificate of authenticity and will announce soon when, where and how much they will be available for purchase. (P.S. we do still have Taylor Center bricks available for purchase!)

Taylor School District -

At its December 20, 2023, meeting, the Taylor School Board proposed a plan to bring financial sustainability to the district. Consolidation of some schools would help with that decision. On January 10, 2024, the board voted 6–1 to go forward with the consolidation. At the end of the 2023-2024 school year, Eureka Heights closed their doors for the final time as the first step in the consolidation. Eureka Heights building will become Johnson Early Start which is now located on Wohlfeil in the former Johnson Elementary school. After the 2024-2025 school year, Johnson will move into the newly renovated building on Eureka Road.

Some other moves that are planned to be made at the end of the 2024-2025 school year are: Hoover Middle school will combine with West Middle school at the West building and possibly be renamed Taylor Middle School; Sixth graders will take over Kinyon Elementary school which is right next door to West, where a walkthrough will be created so the sixth graders can use the facilities at the middle school making it a Middle School complex; Kinyon will move to Johnson's former building; Clarence Randall and some of Taylor Parks students will go to Hoover's building and will be renamed a new elementary, then Randall's building will be demolished; the Taylor Parks students that live in the Pinecrest area will go to Moody and Taylor Parks building will be demolished; Utility Department (formerly Pine Elementary) will be demolished and that department will move to the PRC building near Taylor High School.

Lots of happenings and movements will be going on and hopefully, the new Taylor High School will begin its construction on the former Kennedy site.

The kit included a reproduction of the Declaration of Independence, "Portraits of the Presidents" and other American History items. Mr. Dickelman stated the kits were worth "...far more than a \$1.00 for Social Studies teachers.

During High School I tried to gain admission to the US Air Force Academy. I didn't get accepted that year but I did get into Michigan State. I spent my freshman year there and applied to USAFA again. I was accepted and joined the Class of '83! After graduation, I went to pilot training in Oklahoma flying the Air Force T-37 & T-38. Upon graduation, I was assigned to the 1402 Military Airlift Squadron at Andrew's Air Force Base in Maryland flying C-21's for 4 years.



I was then transferred to northern Michigan at KI Sawyer Air Force Base. There I flew B-52's for 4 years. Me, far left and crew.



I left active duty and went into the Air Force Reserve flying KC-135's at Selfridge Air National Guard Base in Mount Clemens Michigan where I met and married my wife of 28 years! Because of all the civilian flying for Tower Air that began in 1998, I left flying for the Air Force and in 2002 became an Academy Admissions Liaison Officer until I retired in 2006. My job was to meet with the brightest High School students interested in going to the Academy services and guide them through the process.

Being in the reserve is a part time job. As such, I began commercial flying with Kalitta flying various Learjets, the twin turbine Beech aircraft and Mu-2

I left Kalitta and began working for Tower Air, a 747 carrier for 3 years flying all the way around the world carrying people and cargo.

In 2000, I was hired by Jetblue Airways when Tower Air went bankrupt. I've been flying the A320, and A321 ever since and am due to retire next May.



I've enjoyed two careers spanning 20 years each. I've been blessed.
