DOWN MEMORY LANE!

The ups and downs of Taylor Public School's enrollments in September of 1953, the area now known as Taylor, resulted in opening it's first secondary school—Taylor Center High School. Before that time, students living in Taylor Township attended surrounding high schools in Dearborn, Detroit, Melvindale, Romulus and Wyandotte.

The new secondary building started with 7th, 8th and 9th graders. Due to a fast growing population in the township the new school was already overcrowded by 1955 causing students to be scheduled in two sessions, 9th, 10th and 11th graders in the morning and 7th and 8th graders in the afternoon. The first graduating class of 294 students graduated in 1957.

Attempting to keep pace with the growing population, additions were made to Taylor Center High School and in 1958 Taylor Junior High was opened. Several other schools were opened including John F Kennedy High School and Harry S Truman High School. The student population reached it peak in 1970 when 22,250 students were enrolled.

The student enrollment started to decline causing the closing and consolidation of schools. In 1977 the decision was made to

close Taylor Center High School. It was a sad time for the over 14,000 graduates of that school. In 2011 the school was demolished. There are several videos of the demolition on youtube.com this one was uploaded by Frankie Tortonesi.

The current student enrollment for Taylor Public Schools is under 8,000 causing discussions on further closures and consolidations.

District Board of Education Meeting, Board

Mr. Delp to rename the new senior high school
the "John Fitzgerald Kennedy Senior High
School". Roll call vote showed all yeas except
lverson who voted no. Motions carried.

Prior to that motion the new high school was to be named "Charles Brake Senior High School".
