LARRY WRIGHT, JFK 1966, HONORED BY THE UNITED NATIONS

On November 12, 2016, Larry Wright was one of six Rotarians from around the World and the only recipient from North America to be honored by the United Nations. Larry's leadership as founding chair of "Launch Detroit", has generated international interest in a program that is serving as a model for other cities in the USA and around the world.

Mr. Wright's reaction to being honored by the United Nations, "I can't begin to tell you what an honor it is to be recognized with this award, but it truly belongs to a group of dedicated Rotarians, many of whom are entrepreneurs and business owners themselves".

Larry added, "One of the things I am proudest of in

my life is being a Rotarian, as Rotarians, we are volunteers who do good around the world. When you volunteer you give the most expensive and priceless gift anyone could have given—kindness and love."

TAYLOR PUBLIC SCHOOL GRADUATE SUCCESS STORY



Larry Cretul

Larry Cretul remembers the excitement of moving into a new building and being a member of the first Graduating Class of John F Kennedy High School. A strong memory of that year and one half spent in the new high school was being a part of the band program under the direction of Roger Craig. Larry enjoyed the entire band experience, the Pep Rallies, Concerts and being invited to march in special events state wide.

In 1967 he enlisted in the Navy, serving for 4 years. His

sea duty time was aboard the USS Forrestal where he was night shift supervisor on the flight deck, an experience he will never forget. After his discharge he relocated in Ocala Fl.

In 1994 the political bug
bit him and he ran for and
was elected to the Marion
County Commission and
served two terms, a total of
8 years. In 2002 he was
elected to the Florida House
of Representatives. In 2009
during his final term he
was elected to serve as the
Speaker of the House of
Representative for two years.
Due to term limits he then
looked for a new career.

In 2011 along with another former speaker of the house representative, Larry formed a governmental lobbying firm.

They had several blue chip

clients including Disney, AT&T and Hospital Corporation of America. The firm grew to seven full time lobbyists and the client list grew to over 50. September 2016 they merged with one of Florida's largest firms, Grey-Robinson. Mr. Cretul is now part of a firm of 25 lobbyists, 300 lawyers and 13 offices in the State of Florida.

Larry has been married for 48 years to Lana Delves (JFK Class of 1967).
