

He assisted Tom Monaghan with a new Town and University, was an Adjunct Professor of Civil Engineering at Lawrence Technological University, and chaired the Engineering Society of Detroit Editorial Board (ESD). Tom received the Purdue University Alumni Achievement Award and was elected to the ESD College of Fellows. He's a frequent contributor to the Detroit Free Press, Detroit News, Wall Street Journal, Washington Post (and others) on the environment, infrastructure, and non-technical subjects. Tom is the author of Toward the Gleam (Ignatius Press, 2011), Terrapin (Ignatius Press, 2012), Lota (Ignatius Press, 2014), and The Lucifer Ego (TM Doran Books, 2018) all are available on Amazon.com.

Tom's book Terrapin "Terrapin" is a deep dark mystery novel set in a fictional Taylor of the 1960s and 70s. Close friends, four boys and a girl, grow up in Terrapin Township where they experience things that affect their lives for good and ill. When a series of murders devastate what was supposed to be a joyful present-day reunion, Dennis Cole is forced to get to the bottom of it...and fast, as he is in the cross hairs too! How relationships, events, and choices shape lives for years to come is explored.


People who knew the Taylor of the second half of the 20th century will recognize the place where they grew up and the popular culture in those days, along with being immersed in the menace of the story. The author grew up on Irving Street. Tom's latest book "The Lucifer Ego", is the anticipated sequel to Toward the Gleam which was Inspired by J.R.R. Tolkien's The Lord of the Rings, C.S. Lewis's Narnia stories, the Inklings, G.K. Chesterton and other great spirits of the 20th century, and is packed with suspense, mystery, and big questions.

or three decades, Downriver had its very own Coach K.

That's how long Van Kostegian marched the sidelines of a trio of Taylor high schools, before retiring 29 years ago.

He started at Taylor Center High School and finished at Truman High School, but spent the bulk of his time as an Eagle. From 1966 to 1982, Kostegian coached varsity basketball at Kennedy High School.

None of the three schools—or their mascots exists anymore, after Kennedy and Truman merged to form Taylor High School and its mascot, the Griffins, this year.

Still, Kostegian expressed gratification for his time at each during a surprise event Nov. 2nd.

"I'm proud to have been a Ram, an Eagle, and a Cougar," he said, referring to each school's mascot. "I loved my career and have only good things to say about Taylor kids. My message has always been, you don't have to be a champion to be a winner."

Now, 92 years young, Kostegian has an annual scholarship named after him. The \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior from the Taylor School District for each of the next four years.

The criteria for the candidates marry scholastic and athletic accomplishment. Students planning to major in education at the college level and who played basketball for multiple years in high school are eligible.

Two former players—both 1976 graduates of Kennedy High-financed the scholarship, donating the \$8,000. Tim Rogers is currently a senior account executive for the New Era Cap Co. and Gordon Krater is an executive with Plante Moran.

The Taylor Public School Foundation for Educational Excellence hosted the scholarship announcement at The Chopping Block, a student-run restaurant that's part of the culinary arts program at the James I. Maley Career and Technical Center in Taylor.
