#### A HISTORY OF TRUMAN HIGH SCHOOL AS SEEN THROUGH THE EYES OF GALE MITCHELL

Truman school complex opened in 1973. It was a combination school with Truman High and Truman Junior.

The two schools were on different bell schedules. but shared the commons area for lunch, the gym, art and music rooms. It was a new building design with enclosed classrooms only for the subjects that had equipment such as band and chemistry. Other classes did not have walls between rooms. A survey was administered to students to see what they thought of the building. The results showed concerns about the looks of the grounds

outside of the building. Noting the student parking lot was unpaved, the lights at the athletic complex were not working and general landscaping was missing.

A program called "Project Facelift" began the transformation of the Truman building and grounds. A committee of students, staff, citizens, city officials and local landscapers was on hand for the planting of the first tree in front of HST High. "Project Facelift" became an on-going landscaping program on Saturdays with cheerleaders serving free hot dogs and sodas to all the workers. The city of Taylor's Mayor and the Down River **Rotary Club donated** 

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services and landscaping materials. The current landscaping around the building-- including berms, huge graffiti rocks, fenced-in student parking and concession stands--is the result of the "Project Facelift" program.

The State of Michigan presented a Beautification Award to HST High School for an outstanding community effort to beautify a public property. "Project Facelift" celebrated its joint accomplishments by having a bonfire prior to the first "night" Homecoming football game. continued on page 3



# TRANSFORMATION WITHIN 1988 -1998

In 1988, the first walls were erected in the classroom areas.

From 1992-95, many other changes were made within the building such as: Cafeteria A was created so students did not have to eat lunch standing or sitting on the floor.

In 1995, Taylor Center High School was closed, and the students were transferred to Truman, Cafeteria B was created, lockers were installed in the main hall, and additional bleachers were added in the gym to accommodate the additional students.

## ACADEMIC AND PROGRAM TRANSFORMATION

During the 90's, several Truman teachers developed many unique programs such as Jr ROTC, Robotics, Quiz Bowl, and Deca.

Truman was the first district high school to earn Outcomes-Based Accreditation (with an A+ score). The staff developed a MEAP (state test) strategy that significantly raised Truman test scores the highest in the district. The Taylor School District has come full circle and once again has only one COMMUNITY high school.

Gale Mitchell, retired, teacher, and administrator, had a long career in the Taylor School District. Was a teacher at HST starting in 1973 and an administrator there in 1988-89. More of her career and life will be included in the next edition of the Taylor Alumni Newsletter.
