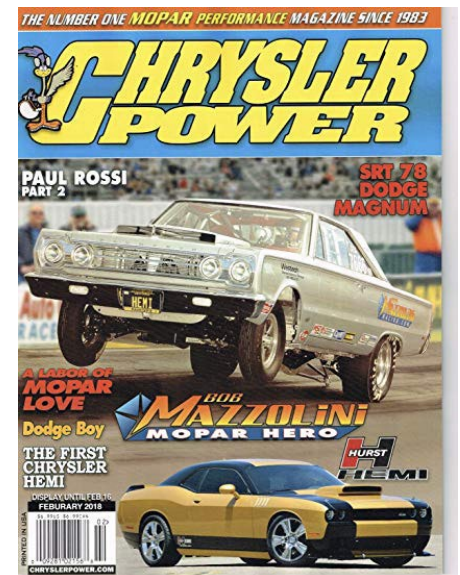

Part 1 of his amazing story starts with – A Dodge Challenger standing itself up on the rear bumper during a quarter mile launch.... The name on the door "Paul Rossi". This 1970 Challenger caught the eye of Chrysler's Engineers who had pumped millions of dollars into the development of Maximum Performance wedges and the Hemi engines. This landed Paul a Sportsman's dream: a full-time factory sponsorship with unlimited engineering data at his disposal. In the ensuing years, Paul threw together a Dodge Mirada and Aspen Stocker, as well as another Miranda for Super Gas eliminator, all the while hosting clinics and seminars. 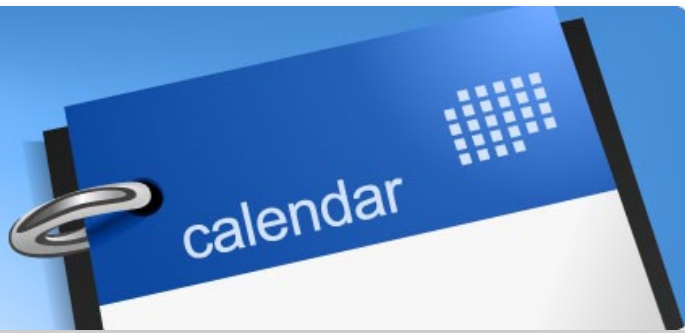
