She and classmate, Cathy LaFace, put on a very successful fund raiser for MD called "Boogie Down". Small wonder her senior class elected her "Most Talented".

Music & Art were Mary's passion. As an artist, she has designed many business logos, illustrated catalogs and painted numerous




GOOD THINGS ARE HAPPENING IN THE CITY OF TAYLOR JUNIOR WORLD SERIES

This is the 35th year the Junior World Series was held in Taylor. The Junior World Series is the "older brother of the more famous Little League World Series held in Williamsport Pa. Little League is for 12 year olds and the Junior League is for 13-14 year olds. The World Series was founded in Taylor by Greg Bzura in 1981. The JLWS started with four USA teams and has grown to 11 teams from around the world. Teams in the United States Division were Midland, Mi, South Carolina, Maryland, Texas and Hawaii. International teams were from Taipei (capital of Taiwan), Australia, Czech Republic, Panama, Alberta Canada and Mexico.


The USA winner was Hawaii and the International winner was Taipei. The 2016 Champion is Taipei as they defeated the United States Champion Hawaii 9 to 1 to conclude another very successful tournament in Taylor.

TAKE A TRIP TO ENGLAND IN THE SUMMER OF 2017


