# Taylor in the News! FLASHBACK-

The June 24, 1928, edition of the Detroit Free Press reported that The Wayne County Road Commission would spend approximately \$90,000 that year on sidewalks. This was the beginning of a program to provide sidewalks to all rural schools in the county for the protection of students. The initial program included 15 schools located on the high speed and most important roads. The Taylor Township schools in this first group were Taylor Center, Sand Hill and Eurekadale

### TRAFFIC LIGHT AT THE INTERSECTION OF TELEGRAPH/AND WICK ROADS

The date was October 17, 1955, when Taylor Public School teacher, Bernice McDowell was making a turn off Telegraph Road on to West bound Wick Road. She was struck by a truck and was killed. She was on her way to teach 7th grade at the Taylor Center High School Building. Fellow teachers and parents for some time felt there should be a traffic light at the Telegraph/Wick Road intersection and had not been able to have one installed. In Mrs. McDowell's memory they formed a human chain across Telegraph Road to block traffic in an

attempt to have the Stop Sign installed. Their actions resulted in a light being installed.

In 1955 the building Taylor Center High School graduated their first class in 1957. Bernice McDowell had a school named after her and is still located on Brest Road off Pardee.
