Da'Stanza Murphy — On March 22, 2015, Da'Stanza Murphy, was crowned "Ms Michigan United States 2015". Da'Stanza, a 2006 graduate of John F Kennedy High School is now going to represent the State of Michigan in the national pageant in June in Washington, D.C. "I'm truly honored to have received this title," Murphy said in an article

published by the "The News-Hearld". She goes on to say "I believe the Miss United States organization is a wonderful opportunity to not only bring bright and beautiful young women together but also give them the opportunity to become community voices for organizations that are vital and need a voice."

During her year of service, Murphy will help raise awareness with her personal community service platform, "Image Inspiration through Education," which helps young girls focus on finding their inner beauty. In addition to being involved in pageantry for nearly 10 years, Murphy has been highly involved in dance over the years as a student and former instructor with the Taylor Dance Program under the direction of Joy Squire, and is a superior-rated mezzo-soprano Italian operatic.

Professionally, Da'Stanza has earned a Bachelor's degree in broadcast journalism and a Master's degree in public relations both from Wayne State University. She currently works as a public relations coordinator for the Detroit Public School's office of communications.

Taylor Foundation Receives a \$30,0000 Donation for Scholarships



Charles Dickelman, retired Taylor Educator, has designated \$30,000 to be used as scholarships. Charlie or as he was known "The Big D" taught in several schools in the Taylor system. "THE BIG D", is one of the most liked teachers in the history of the Taylor School District. He started in 1957 in Taylor Center Elementary (the same year as the first graduating class of Taylor Center High School), then moved on to Taylor Jr High, Brake Jr. High, John F. Kennedy High School and Taylor Center High School. Coincidently, retiring the same year as the last Taylor Center graduating class of 1997.

In addition to his classroom teaching, he was assistant coach in baseball and tennis and was yearbook advisor at both JFK & TCH. Though he is now retired, Charlie has not and most likely never will retire from his ties with the Taylor School District or its' students. Starting in 2016, a Charles Dickelman Scholarship award of \$2500 will be offered for the next 12 years or more to a graduating student who has are accepted to the University of Michigan or the University of Michigan Dearborn.

After being in a coma for a year, Jacob made a miraculous recovery. However, the medical benefits were minimal and Jacob was in need of a new wheelchair. That is when Tara Carlin stepped in to help. She met with school administrators and suggested a fund raiser. Students are normally not permitted to wear hats in the building. Tara asked for permission to allow hats for one day if the wearer would donate \$1 toward a fund for Jacob's wheelchair. Permission was granted and \$350 was donated to the fund.
