WHERE ARE THEY NOW? CAROL GAUTHIER KRYANAK

Carol Gauthier Kryanak graduated from Taylor Center High in 1971. She then went to Central Michigan University and graduated with a B.A. in Education including classes in the teaching of driver's education. She was hired to teach Drivers Training at Mt. Pleasant High School. In 1977 she moved to Grand Rapids to teach Drivers Training in the Grand Rapids public schools. The district had a driving range and received grants for driving simulators to supplement on the road driving. Carol also taught adults who needed to improve driving skills. She had a class of immigrants from Viet Nam and in order to teach them she had to learn enough of their language to cover all the safety rules and road signs.

She moved to Saginaw in 1983 and began employment with Saginaw County Community Mental Health where she worked as case manager for adults with developmental disabilities. Carol participated in the deinstitutional movement at the Caro Regional Mental Health Center. Working as a behavior specialist in Anger Management, her desire to return to teaching became evident. She renewed her teaching certification while earning a Master of Arts in teaching from Saginaw Valley State University. She taught in a program for children with autism before retiring in 2014. Her memories of TCH include French as taught by Monsieur Geib. She visited Paris and used some of the French she had learned. Mr. Walters helped her overcome her trepidation of Geometry and Trig. That helped her through the rest of her education. Typing and English classes also provided a strong basis for career and educational success. The after-school clubs, such as GAA and the Ski Club, started her on the path to maintaining physical fitness.

Carol still lives in Saginaw where she and her husband, Mark, raised two children. She keeps busy with two grandchildren, managing her rental properties and as a member of the Saginaw Landlords Association. Her siblings also benefited from their Taylor School District education. David Gauthier (now deceased) graduated from TCH, Charlotte, Barbara and Lyle all are HST graduates. All are Taylor Alumni Association Lifetime members.
