#### Reg Dickson, JFK teacher and

**counselor,** attended the 50th reunion of the JFK Class of 1969. Later he told me he met graduate Michael Bates and was very impressed with Michael's achievements after graduation. I contacted Michael and asked for the write up that follows.

I attended our JFK 50th class reunion and It was a pleasure to be seated with Mr. Dickson. Although I never had him as a teacher, I am sure he was a great one. There are so many memories of my years at JFK, that I would never be able to mention all of them. Aside from my Parents, the teachers I had at JFK have influenced my life tremendously! Mr. Checkler, Mr. Schediers, and Mr. Garthe to only name a few. Mr. Checkler was my Sociology teacher in

the 10th grade, he would bring in the Detroit News and the Free Press and that was our study. We learned so much about world events and local news as we discussed everything. Mr. Schediers taught Electricity. He taught us the right way to wire a home, and every time I work with electricity, I think of him. Mr. Garthe taught Machine Shop, the things I learned from him has stayed with me all of my life. He taught us welding and worked on and used every machine that was in the Machine Shop. Most of all, he always stressed safety. My junior and senior years I was working for Synthetex Inc., a local Taylor company that built custom cars for Chrysler and Ford companies. The owner, Ron Mondrush, was impressed with all the machines that I could not only use but use them correctly. In early 1969 we built a custom show car for Chrysler. I ended up doing most of the fiberglass work and ended up painting the vehicle which was on the cover of July 1969 Motor Trend Magazine. In 1972 I was drafted into the US Army, I missed serving in Vietnam by a miracle, I ended up in Germany for 13 months and days. My typing skills from JFK, landed me in Supply. After the Army and much speculating, I opened my own Collision shop in Taylor, "Mike Bates Collision Service". In my career, I have been certified in Engine Major, Engine Minor, Brakes, Suspension, Auto AC, Auto electric, SRS protection system, ABS, I-Car certified, also Vehicle Appraiser to include Heavy Equipment. In 1988 my wife and I made a move to Tennessee, where we continue on page 4

are both from. I was born in Tennessee and my wife's family was from Tennessee. It was a great move for us. We have two daughters Natalie and Alicia. In 2003 I went to work with Crawford and Co. as a vehicle appraiser, traveled in middle Tennessee doing appraisals on collision vehicles. In 2006 I started my own Appraisal Company. This has taken me all over the United States doing Catastrophic appraisals on vehicles. I was working in Wisconsin in 2018 when, a co- worker suggested that I send my resume to the Bosch Corporation. Bosch was looking for people with my background. I was hired in June of 2018. This has taken me to 15 countries in the Caribbean. We are replacing Takata air bags in Honda recall vehicles. My wife Rhonda asked me just the other day, if I could have been in any other career what would it have been. It took a moment before I said I would not change a thing. I have had

the honor to meet and work with some of the greatest people in the Automotive business. I am proud to be one of them. As a 17 year-old, graduating from high school, I did not desire or feel the need to go to college. My career had already begun. Many things have shaped my life. I am so happy to say that JFK was a big part of my life and my career. - \* Built in 1964 opened in 1965
- \* Closed in 2018
- \* Still standing...future uncertain

#### HARRY S TRUMAN HIGH SCHOOL

- Built in 1973 and occupied in the Fall of that year.
- ★ Closed June of 2018
- Re-opened September of 2018 as Taylor High School.
