First a little background on one of the most popular teachers and administrators to serve in the Taylor School District. Bob graduated from Northern Michigan University with a Math Major in 1959. He immediately started is career in Taylor, accepting a math position at Brake Jr. High. While teaching he continued working on advanced degrees and earned a Masters Degree and then a Specialists Degree in Secondary Education from Eastern Michigan University. Mr. Haarala then taught math at Taylor Center High and John F Kennedy High. His talents and personality were known by all and he was encouraged to become an administrator. First an Assistant Principal at Taylor Jr High, next an Assistant Principal at Taylor Center High and then on to the board office as Assistant Superintendent. At all levels Bob Haarala earned the respect of students and staff. Bob retired in 1998 but still maintains contacts with students and staff in the School bowling league and golf league. Bob still lives in Plymouth and is active in Taylor activities.

Mr. Haarala was recently honored by a student he worked with in Taylor Jr High in the 1970's. he made such an impression on the student, Eric Gaffka that recently Eric contacted John Pantalone and asked how he could show his admiration for Mr. Haarala as an administrator and even more so as a person. Eric decided to finance a scholarship in Mr. Haarala's name. He asked that Bob establish the criteria and the award will be presented by Bob to a graduate of the class of 2019.
