Charlie Green A real "Michigan Man" Charlie Green is ailing. The Detroit Free Press recently ran and article on Charlie Green, who for more than 15 years, was the clubhouse manager at the U of M Golf Course. And for 52 years, he worked summers around the University of Michigan course and the Radwick Farms Golf Course. Charlie was also the timekeeper for Michigan Football games for 46 years and men's basketball for 45, retiring from both in 2012. He also helped run the game clock and scoreboard for the women's basketball team.

Green served four years on the board of directors of the University Alumni Association and for his service he was honored with an Honorary Varsity M and a letter jacket in 2002 which he wore proudly. For his support and promotion of women's golf, especially at the U-M course he received a certificate signed by two state legislators. His charity work included helping put together a yearly C.S. Mott Children's Hospital Golf fundraiser that raised millions of dollars for the hospital.

"Charlie Green is an incredible ambassador for the University of Michigan, former U of M football coach, Lloyd Carr said.

Charlie Green was a Teacher in The Taylor School System for decades until retiring in the early 1990's to work full time at the U of M. What a great career Charlie had at Michigan. He is married to Jean who also taught in Taylor.

Charlie Green is now 80, has pancreatic cancer – held off by multiple surgeries and treatments, but has now been placed in Hospice care. We found Ralph in Sunnyvale California. Ralph, a 1961 graduate of Taylor Center High, is now retired after a long career in Aero Space Engineering. Ralph earned degrees at U of M Dearborn and a Masters in Electrical Engineering from the University of Santa Clara in California. Most of his career was with Lockheed's Missiles and Space Division. During his tenure with Lockheed, Ralph's duties included working on the AGENA Spacecraft; assigned to Ford to help them apply aerospace design techniques to their electric car; to France to oversee some battery work; to the Marshall Islands to support Missile Launches; and worked on the solar array and thermal radiator joint motor controllers for the International Space Station.

The Taylor Alumni Association congratulates Ralph Babcock on a great career and the Alumni Association is very proud of the education that has and is still being provided in our public schools.

Dual Enrollment Program

Dual Enrollment is a program that allows Taylor Public School Student (usually sophomores, juniors, and seniors) to enroll in college courses and earn high school and college credits prior to high school graduation.

Harry S Truman High School is very proud of 7 seniors who have participated in the program for two years and have earned 25 college credits. Enrollment for the 2016-17 school year has projected 33 juniors

and senior will join in the Dual Enrollment Program. Kennedy reported 37 students took part in the dual enrollment and they earned a total of 600 college credits. 🗠

U.S. New & World Report

Earlier this year US News & World Report announced it's U.S. News Best High Schools Rankings. Rankings include data on more than 21,000 public schools in 50 states and the District of Columbia. The 2016 Best High Schools rankings, awards the top 6,517 public high schools with gold, silver and bronze medals, based on their performance on state assessments and how well they prepare students for college.



John F Kennedy received the Bronze Award given to only 25% of the high schools for excellence and achievement for schools with similar demographics in the United States. Kennedy has been given that award for 3 consecutive years and is the only school in the downriver area to have achieved that record. *K*

Again this year JFK had every senior apply for admission to some for of higher education. Mr. Tommy Saylor, Kennedy Principal, reported that as of this date 82% of graduating seniors have been accepted by Colleges and University. 🗠
