TAYLOR FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIPS PRESENTED

Thirty-six awards totaling \$36,600 were granted on June 5, 2019 during Taylor High School's Farewell Assembly. The scholarship offering is a function of the Taylor School District Foundation for Educational Excellence.

New awards this year were made honoring Robert Haarala, Rollie Hopgood, Van Kostegian and John Pantalone. The scholarship committee had a very successful year in fundraising as \$68,000 was obtained and designated for future distribution. Significantly, \$10,000 has been committed annually for trade school applicants by an anonymous donor in recognition that the college route is not the only path chosen by successful students.

he JFK Class of 1969 had the first Homecoming parade that included floats. We marched on a beautiful fall day and attended the football game with Dearborn Lowrey. At half-time we were entertained by the great marching band under the direction of Mr. Roger Crain and with Drum Major Tom Fioritti leading the band in a rendition of Up, Up and Away. The team took care of that with a great 53-12 over the Lowery Bears. The Eagles finished the season with a 7 win 2 loss record. They broke Schafer High Schools 17 game winning streak with a 19-12 win. Rex Baugh, Jim Chapman and Keith Baxter received many honors including "All League" and "All Area" first team awards. Stu Kerr received all those awards and an "All State Honorable Mention.

That was the first of many successes for the class of 69. The Debate Team under the Direction of Mr. Clements were top contenders for the State Title and Dave Egger was the top debater in the district.

The JFK band made a name for themselves performing in many venues including half-time at a Detroit Lion Football game.

Success for our athletic teams continued with the basketball team posting a 12-4 record under Coach Kosteglan. The record included wins over city rival Taylor Center 52-48 and handing Garden City its only league loss 59-43.

The JFK Gymnasts continued the fine athletic season with a 3rd place in State Competition and Dan Witz was the first JFK athlete to be chosen "All State Performer." Coach Bechtol's team was a league and downriver power.

We all remember Presidential Candidate Hubert Humphry attending a band practice and, after seeing the fine band, told them if he won the Presidential election, he would have them march in the inaugural parade.

Can you believe there were over 20 after school organizations and clubs you could choose to participate in?

WHERE ARE THEY NOW?

Mike Connelley 1969 JFK High School Graduate

The first thoughts of JFK were instilled when I was at Brake Junior High. We knew that almost all of West Jr. High would be going to JFK, while obviously most if not all of Taylor Jr. High would be going to TCH. But Brake was split down the middle. It was bittersweet, but also fun. Especially if you were in band. There was always a feeling of JFK vs. TCH on every occasion they met. All the junior high school bands were able to perform at the TCH vs. Kennedy football games. Which brings me to my favorite teacher who instilled all of that spirit. Mr. Roger Craig.

Being part of the JFK band is what made going to school an absolute delight. I was all in. As a sophomore, we won every first-place trophy in every parade we participated in. We achieved a number one rating at our district band festival in our senior year. We marched twice in the J. L. Hudson Thanksgiving Parade and were twice the featured band performing at Detroit Lions' games, usually an honor reserved for small local colleges.

Academics were also important. Teachers that I will always remember are Mr. Charles

Dickelman, Miss Osadchuk and Mr. Kozik. Additionally, many years after school, I developed business and social relationships with Bob Schnieders and Mr. Jaffke. And, I really enjoyed Mr. Vandette.

Life after JFK did not go according to plan. After receiving a music scholarship to Wayne State University, I fell ill and missed most of my second quarter. I lost my deferment and had a low draft number which prompted me to enlist in the USAF. However, the happy ending is that it all led to a long and successful career in Information Technology. It all led to a wonderful opportunity to do Websites for causes near and dear to me such as Veteran and Pro Troop causes, as well as our Class of 1969 reunion site. It's easier, because all of those sites allow me to use Eagles as part of the mastheads.
