#### Beautiful Heritage Park has a collection of Historical Buildings you must see:

- → Greenwald-Herkimer Home gingerbread decorated home built in early 1900
- → Train Station replica of original was constructed by students from the Taylor Career Center
- → Heritage Park Schoolhouse- replica also constructed by Taylor Career Center students
- → Water powered mill
- Schoensheck House
- → Township Hall
- ... and several others

*Sad news-* The Heritage West Mound Church built in 1882 was heavily damaged in a fire. The church contained beautiful stained-glass windows, and an 1845 Detroit Farand Pipe Organ. It had been used for a variety of concerts. It became a popular wedding destination.

The **Taylor Historical Society** maintains these buildings and furnishes them with collected antiques.
