CLOSED ELEMENTARY SCHOOL BUILDINGS

Bartlett Elementary School

- ★ Built in 1966
- ★ Closed in ?
- Bartlett was a preschool for a short period and an adult education center in the mid-1970's
- ★ Renamed Racho
- ★ Closed June 2007
- ★ Razed in 2010

Brake Middle School

* Built November 17, 1958 with 36 rooms

- \star Closed in 2007
- Reopened as The Sixth Grade Academy September 2007
- ★ Closed in June of 2016

Edgewood Elementary

- ★ Built in 1928
- * Addition built in 1971
- * Razed & Replaced by Housing Development

Edison Elementary

- ★ Built in 1938
- ★ 2 rooms added in 1948
- ★ 4 rooms added in 1951
- * Razed & replaced by a Condominum Complex ?
- * Condominum Complex was torn down

Eurekadale Elementary School

- ★ Built in 1960
- * Addition built in 1971
- Downriver Guidance Center Head Start Program, moved out 2019

Fletcher Elementary School

- ★ Built with 4 rooms on March 21, 1938
- * Added 2 rooms in 1947
- ★ Added 4 rooms in 1957
- * Added 6 rooms in 1962
- ★ Closed in ?
- * Razed in 2017
- * Currently City-owned Green Space

G Mennen Williams Elementary School

- ★ Built in 1957
- ★ Closed in ?
- Remodeling done and renamed the William
 D. Ford Senior Activity Center

Lyndon B. Johnson Elementary School

- ★ Built in 1959
- * Addition built in 1962
- ★ Closed in ?
- * Renamed Johnson Preschool Center ?
- ★ Closed in 2009
- Preschool was temporarily relocated back to Johnson after a fire in the preschool wing of Clarence Randall.
- ★ Closed in 2010
- Placed back into three schools (McDowell, Moddy and Kinyon).
- Re-Opened as Johnson Early Childhood
 Program in September of 2014

Monroe Elementary School

- ★ Built in 1960 with 12 rooms
- ★ Closed in ?
- ★ Razed in 2011
- * The property is now used a Green Space

Pine Elementary School

- ★ Built in 1960 with 10 rooms

- Formally Barlett Elementary School, Special Education Department and then Taylor Parks and Recreation Department
- * Razed in 2010 used as Green Space
- * Property is now used for Green Space

- * Currently a residential home
