# School Consolidation Information

We are still getting questions about the need to consolidate into one high school. Here are several reasons given by the board:

 ✓ Ongoing concerns about declining enrollment. District enrollment has declined from 20,000 total students to 7,000.

√ JFK and HST individual low enrollments presents a challenge to offer all of the courses the district wishes to offer.

√ JFK has two stories and if improvements were to be made they would have to install elevators for handicapped students at a huge expense.

√ JFK has a failed pool heater and pump and, a compromised boiler system.

A second question asked is why JFK and not HST?

√ As mentioned above, Kennedy is the older of the two schools, has two stories without an elevator for wheelchair-bound students and has less functional capacity that Truman. *K*□

➢ Annette and Jack Aronson, co-founders of Garden Fresh Gourmet, celebrated the grand opening of the Great Lakes High-Pressure Processing Food Innovation Center April 5th. The operation aims to extend the shelf life of food products and serve as an incubator for local food companies. High-pressure processing uses a cold pasteurizing technique in which already packaged food is subjected to extremely high water pressure to kill pathogens and make food safer and fresher longer without artificial preservatives. Aronson has a 15 year lease on the 45,000 square-foot building at 21740 Trolley Industrial Drive, but said he plans to buy it and expand to nearly 250,000 square feet.
