year and all high school students will attend what is now Truman High School. All ninth grade students in the district are currently enrolled in Truman High.

For the starting day the two groups combined as one team and volunteered at the local Gleaners for a day of working together and getting to know each other. The remainder of the day was spent brainstorming ways to help make the consolidation as smooth as possible. Remembering JFK Administrators



JFK Principal Anthony Matulis

Your Alumni Association Board thought you would like to recall the administrators from the start of JFK High School.

In 1963 architectural plans were created for a new high school to be named Charles Brake High. At a board meeting that year, school board member Richard Trolley motioned to name the new high school John F Kennedy High. That motion passed 6-1 and JFK was created. The construction of the building was sufficiently completed in the fall of 1964 to lay plans for the first students and staff to move into the building. Mr. Anthony Matulis, Principal of Taylor Center High School at that time, was asked to be Principal of John F Kennedy and to make plans for the move to take place during the 2nd semester of the 1964-65 school year. Attendance zones were laid out indicating the 10th & 11th graders

that would be moved to the new JFK. A staff also had to be selected. A very smooth move was made in early 1965 and the building was occupied by 10th & 11th graders. Mr. Matulis was the Principal and James Maley was named the Assistant Principal. The 1965-66 school year started with grades 10, 11 & 12. Mr. James Maley, Principal and Richard Lininger and John Pantalone his Assistants. The Counselors were Carl Bargamian, Leo Goetz, Mrs. LaLonde, Vera Ohanisian, Stan Trierweiler and Anna Weaks.

That portion of the staff remained for the rest of the 1960's with one exception, Mrs. LaLonde retired and was replaced with Frank Troesch. Those no longer with us are: Anthony Matulis, James Maley, Richard Lininger, Irene LaLonde, Stan Trieweiler, Anna Weaks and Frank Troesch. John Pantalone is living in Westland, Michigan and is still involved in the schools through the Taylor Public Schools Foundation and the Taylor Alumni Association. Carl Bargamian retired as Principal of JFK and is living in Port Austin, Michigan. Vera Ohanisian married Tom Manley and is living in Howell, Michigan. Dr. Leo Goetz retired and moved to Sun City, Az.

In the next edition we will catch up with news of the teaching staff from JFK in the 60's.

A 16 YEAR TENURE

One principal served JFK for 16 years—That is the longest time of any high school principal in Taylor. His name is Carl Bargamian. We received the following letter from Carl...

I joined the faculty at Taylor Center High School in September, 1957 as a member of the business department and was appointed to the guidance department in 1961; I continued as a counselor at JFK through June, 1973. When Truman High School opened in the fall of 1973, I was appointed as Assistant Principal, in 1978 I was appointed to serve as principal of JFK and remained in that position for the next 16 years until I retired in June of 1994. My wife Zoe and I retired to port Austin, Michigan and celebrated 60 years of marriage in August. we have been blessed with four children, eleven grand children and two great grand children.

Taylor School District gave me the opportunity to enjoy a wonderful and rewarding career. I would like to thank the community, the central Administration and the parents. Thank you to the facilities and support staff. Great People.

A special thank you to all the students that I had the pleasure to serve during my 37 year career. You have given me hundreds of wonderful memories.
