I graduated from JFK in 1972. After graduation, I attended Wayne County Community College where I received an Associate Degree in Criminal Justice. I've been involved in music for most of my life and have played in several bands including; The Peach Band, Hot Lucy, The Vintage Band, Cold Blue Steel and am currently playing with Full Tilt Boogie/ Detroit. I was fortunate to play with Ricky Nelson the August before he died, and with The Contours and Freddy Boom Boom Cannon.



I married my lovely wife, Lynda Soloman, (also a JFK grad) in 1979. We have three wonderful sons. James, the oldest, graduated from Eastern Michigan University. He taught guitar and drums at the Arbor School of Music. He is now living in Chicago and working at Venmo. Our son Nicholas also received his undergraduate and graduate degrees from Eastern. He taught at JFK for 11 years and is now teaching in Woodhaven. Our third son, Michael, attended Washtenaw Community College and the Colorado Institute of Arts where he studied film. He lives in Denver and is currently in a band called The Patient Zeros. They are recording and touring the country. All three of our sons are wonderful musicians.

We purchased our first house in 1979 in Southgate Michigan. We then moved to Saline in 1986 and built our beautiful home on 10 acres, where we raised our family. In 2002 we

wo new major residential projects have been approved.

▷ The Terraces at Autumn Woods includes 52 single-family condos, located near the northeast corner of Pennsylvania and Inkster Road. Built on 16 acres, the project will feature a walking path with a view of a large conservation area.

Aberdee at Racho is a 52 unit development of 26 duplex buildings located on 11.5 acres on Northline across from Wayne County Community College's Downriver Campus.

Neighborhood parks are being improved. Northwest Park, the home of the only outdoor pool in the community is undergoing a major facelift. A long new walking and biking path is being added, as is a concert/entertainment/ soccer-type area. A new playscape, pavilion, game tables, and a fitness area are also being added. The existing basketball courts, which are heavily used, are being cleaned, restriped and new backboards and rims are being installed. The northwest corner is the sixth area of Taylor that has been targeted for improvements as part of the Good to Great Neighborhood Program.

## WHAT YOU MIGHT NOT KNOW ABOUT TAYLOR

There were 11 graduating classes before Taylor became a city.

The first class graduating from Taylor Center High School was the class of 1957. At that time the community was still Taylor Township and remained so until 1968.

Did you know the Taylor Center High School building on Wick Road was the only Secondary School building? When Taylor Center High first opened the Senior High Students attended classes in the morning and grades 7 & 8 in the afternoon as there were no Jr High buildings until Taylor Jr. High was built.
